Day 1 – Arrival in Krakow

Activity	Description
Arrival and Transport to Accommodation	A dedicated local CAS Trips leader will greet the group at the airport before traveling to the accommodation.
Check-in and relax	Check-in, relax, and freshen up following the long journey.
Walking tour of Krakow	A fascinating introduction to the unique history and culture of Poland's second city, visiting and learning about the UNESCO-listed Old Town from your CAS Trip Leader.
Evening Meal	Enjoy a traditional Polish cuisine.

Day 2 – Creativity, Activity

Activity	Description
Urban Art Tour	Groups will visit some of the city's street art hotspots and learn how to decipher art from vandalism while also encountering one of the city's biggest problems – offensive graffiti, often the result of football hooligan rivalry.
Lunch	Enjoy a packed lunch together as a group.
Museum of Modern Art (MOCAK)	MOCAK presents the art of the two last decades in the context the post-war movements, as well as highlighting the cognitive and ethical value of art and its relationship with everyday reality.

After touring the exhibitions we will participate in a hands on workshop lead by a local artist.

Evening Meal Enjoy a traditional meal as a group.

Day 3 – Activity

Activity	Description
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Auschwitz Birkenau Tour In a private excursion lead by an excellent official Auschwitz guide, participants visit two parts of the memorial where 1.1 million men, women and children perished in The Holocaust.

Lunch Stop between tours to eat a packed lunch.

Meet Holocaust Survivors In cooperation with the Galicia Jewish Museum, students have the opportunity to meet with survivors of the holocaust or their family members. The group will hear the stories of those personally affected by the camp they are visiting.

Evening Meal Enjoy amazing Asian cuisine.

Day 4 – Creativity, Service

Activity	Description
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Service Challenge: Historic Preservation Project In the Southern Krakow district of Podgórze lies the grounds of Płaszów Concentration Camp. Płaszów is reliant on dedicated volunteers which include the participants who will roll their sleeves up and engage in a wonderful example of hands-on community service.

Lunch Have some tasty international cuisine selection.

Improv Theater Workshop and Show Students participate in a dynamic English-speaking Improv workshop with members of a local theatre group.



Participants will get to express their creative side will learning from professionals.
