We want your CAS Trip to be safe and enjoyable for all those involved, which is why we have a strict set of rules that apply to all of our student participants. We ask you to read these rules carefully, together with your parents, and make sure you are aware of what is expected of you throughout your trip.

Both you and your parents must read and accept the rules by signing and handing it in to your school chaperone or scan the document and email it to **info@castrips.org** before you embark on your journey.

YOUR CAS TRIPS REPRESENTATIVES ARE IN CHARGE

CAS Trips and our trusted third party partners are your chaperones during your trip. You should always respect their judgment in all situations. They are there to make your trip safer and more enjoyable. Because you are traveling with a group, you will have to adapt to the life of the group and follow leaders' instructions.

INHERENT RISKS OF TRAVEL

By committing to participating in a CAS Trips experience, each participant is also committing to immerse in foreign culture and accept that this type of adventurous travel comes with inherent risks.

While CAS Trips take all reasonable measures to mitigate these risks, certain risks cannot be eliminated without destroying the unique character of immersive, educational activities.

Risks can include, but are not limited to; physical injury, food-related illness and natural hazards and an up to date risk assessment will be provided upon request.

DRESS CODE

Please dress appropriately for every occasion, keeping in mind the culture of your host nation. You will receive a clothing list along with these House Rules prior to arrival.

ACTIVITY “CHECK IN” IS OBLIGATORY

All students are required to “check in” with their CAS Trips representative for every activity. In case you are not feeling well, you need to inform your guide before the activity starts. We will then be able to organize a member of our staff to watch you while you recover.

LOCAL RULES AND REGULATIONS

You will need to abide by the local rules and laws of the country you travel to. Any student engaging in illegal activity will be sent home at the parents’ own expense.

SHOPLIFTING

Shoplifting is theft and is regarded as a serious crime. If you are caught stealing, from a shop or any other person, you will be sent home at your parents’ expense without a warning. If your case goes to court you will also be liable to cover all the trial costs.

BULLYING AND THREATENING BEHAVIOR

All CAS Trips participants are expected to treat fellow travelers, CAS Trips staff and all others with respect. Any violent, insolent or inappropriate behavior will not be tolerated or accepted. We do not tolerate any racism, sexism or homophobic behavior. The same applies to any attitude which would prevent the smooth running of the trip. We reserve the right to prohibit participation of participants if CAS Trips’ staff deem them to have violated these terms and conditions.

ALCOHOL, SMOKING AND DRUGS

You will be in the care of CAS Trips representatives at all times - including night-time monitors. Despite this, we need to remind you that the purchase, possession and/or consumption of alcohol and drugs are strictly prohibited for all students even if you are over 18 years of age and regardless of the laws of your home country. For safety reasons, any student engaging in alcohol and drugs will be sent home at the parents’ own expense.

DAMAGES

If you cause damage to someone else's property, be it to your accommodation, venues, the residence or any other facilities we are using, you will be liable to pay for damages before returning home. Remember to check your travel insurance for liability coverage.

CURFEW TIMES

Any evening activities will be supervised by your CAS Trips representative. You are forbidden to leave the designated accommodation unless otherwise specified by a CAS Trips representative at all other times. There will be plenty of entertainment and activity opportunities to enjoy in your spare time.

IF YOU BREAK THE RULES

If you break the rules, disciplinary steps can lead to being sent home at your parents' own expense. The decision to send you home will be made together with CAS Trips management, on-site guides and the camp director. Your parents will then be informed. CAS Trips and its representatives reserve the right to send you home without negotiations if you risk your own or other peoples' safety by your actions or if you break the law. CAS Trips and its representative dismissal policies are clearly outlined in the Terms and Conditions page, available on the website or upon request.

IMAGES AND PHOTOGRAPHY

CAS Trips will be employing a professional photography team to capture the magic of the Global Student Exchange. Schools and individual participants will have access to this via CAS Trips' social media pages in the weeks following the end of the trip.

We will ask for your permission to allow CAS Trips to use photos and videos of the Global Student Exchange program for promotional purposes and to waive any right to compensation arising from or related to use of photographs or videos of your image. Should any individual not be comfortable with this. Please notify CAS Trips immediately.
