Below you will find directions and information regarding recommended best practices for course usage.

Important Course Information

Print vs Digital: The resources have been designed in an editable PDF format so students can complete them digitally. Please do consider the environment before printing.

Viewing students' work: You must provide students with instructions on how and where they should upload/store their finished assignments. For example, you could create a dedicated G-Drive folder for them or instruct them where they should upload their assignments in your school's Learning Management System. This will allow you to view and track their assignments.

Student grouping & division: The course has many activities that are created as opportunities for students to collaborate in groups. Activities are created for partner and group collaboration, so assigning partners within groups of 3-5 students will allow for the best use of the course. Students must coordinate how to best collaborate on tasks.

Chronology: To offer you the flexibility to use the modules and assignments in a way that suits your CAS program, modules are independent and interchangeable and can be used in any order that suits you and your CAS program structure.

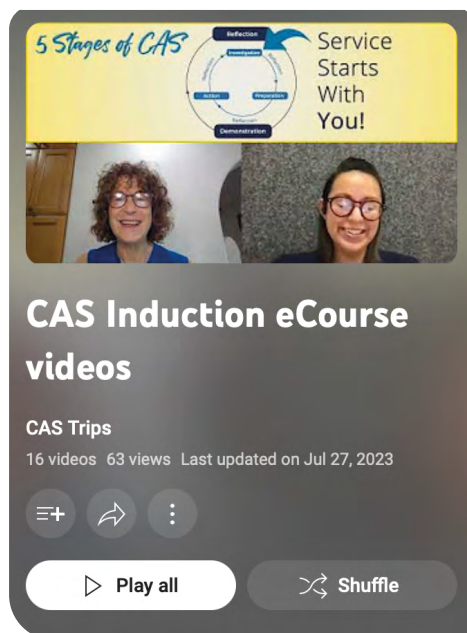
